



1           5.       In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 6,  
2 2020 to May 1, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in  
3 section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody  
4 pending dependency proceedings must be released from custody to not more than 7 days (Gov.  
5 Code, § 68115(a)(11));

6           6.       In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on from April 6,  
7 2020 to May 1, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in  
8 section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody  
9 pending dependency proceedings must be given a detention hearing to not more than 7 days  
10 (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));


11           7.       In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 6,  
12 2020 to May 1, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time periods provided in  
13 sections 632 and 637 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into  
14 custody pending wardship proceedings and charged with a felony must be given a detention  
15 hearing or rehearing to not more than 7 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));

16           8.       In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 6,  
17 2020 to May 1, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in  
18 section 334 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a juvenile  
19 dependency petition must be held by not more than 15 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(12)); and

20           9.       In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 6,  
21 2020 to May 1, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in  
22 section 657 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a wardship petition  
23 for a minor charged with a felony offense must be held by not more than 15 days (Gov. Code,  
24 § 68115(a)(12)).
