

DO I NEED TO GO TO COURT?

<u>Traffic Cases</u>	If you were scheduled to appear in court for a Traffic case between the dates of March 23 and April 16, you <u>do not need</u> to attend the hearing.	Within several weeks, the Court will mail you a written notice setting forth the date and time of your continued hearing.
<u>Small Claims</u>	If you were scheduled to appear in court for a Small Claims case between the dates of March 23 and April 16, you <u>do not need</u> to attend the hearing.	Within several weeks, the Court will mail you a written notice setting forth the date and time of your continued hearing.
<u>Civil and Probate</u>	Hearings between the dates of March 23 and April 16 will be rescheduled. You <u>do not need</u> to attend the hearing.	The Court will send you or your attorney written notice of the date and time of your continued hearing.
<u>Civil Harassment Restraining Orders</u>	Cases scheduled for a hearing on a request for a Civil Harassment Restraining Order will <u>proceed as scheduled</u> . You <u>need</u> to attend the hearing.	If your hearing is set between the dates of March 23 and April 16, <u>you should attend the hearing.</u>
<u>Family Law</u>	Hearings between the dates of March 23 and April 16 will be rescheduled. You <u>do not need</u> to attend the hearing.	The Court will send you or your attorney written notice of the date and time of your continued hearing.
<u>Adoptions</u>	Adoption hearings set from March 23 through May 1 will be continued to after June 1. You <u>do not need</u> to attend the hearing.	The Court will send you or your attorney written notice of the date and time of your continued hearing.
<u>Domestic Violence Restraining Orders</u>	Cases scheduled for a hearing on a request for a Domestic Violence Restraining Order will <u>proceed as scheduled</u> . You <u>need</u> to attend the hearing.	If your hearing is set between the dates of March 23 and April 16, <u>you should attend the hearing.</u>
<u>Emergency Child Custody Orders</u>	Cases scheduled for a hearing on a request for an Emergency Child Custody Order will <u>proceed as scheduled</u> . You <u>need</u> to attend the hearing.	If your hearing is set between the dates of March 23 and April 16, <u>you should attend the hearing.</u>

DO I NEED TO GO TO COURT?

<p><u>Juvenile Cases</u></p>	<p>Many Juvenile cases will be rescheduled. Please contact your attorney or your child’s attorney to determine if you need to attend the hearing.</p>	<p>Unless your attorney tells you the case has been rescheduled, <u>you should attend the hearing.</u></p>
<p><u>Guardianship/ Conservatorship</u></p>	<p>Except as noted below, hearings in Guardianship and Conservatorship cases will be rescheduled. You <u>do not need</u> to attend the hearing.</p>	<p>The Court will send you or your attorney written notice of the date and time of your continued hearing.</p>
<p><u>Conservatorships LPs</u></p>	<p>Petitions for appointment of LPS conservator scheduled from March 23 through April 16 will be heard. <u>You need to attend the hearing</u></p>	<p>If your hearing is set between the dates of March 23 and April 16, <u>you should attend the hearing.</u></p>
<p><u>Criminal Cases Arraignments</u></p>	<p>If you were released on your own recognizance, a bail bond, or citation, and signed a written promise to appear in court for arraignment, <u>you need to attend the hearing unless you make arrangements with the Public Defender or your attorney</u></p>	<p>Contact the Public Defender or your attorney and ask them if they will make a “977 Appearance” for you. You can contact the Public Defender at PubDef977@stancounty.com, even if you have not yet appeared in court or retained an attorney</p>
<p><u>Criminal Cases Trials</u></p>	<p>If your trial is scheduled during the period March 23 to April 16, it will be rescheduled. The Court will send your attorney the date and time of your next court appearance. <u>You do not need to appear in court for your trial.</u></p>	<p>Contact the Public Defender or your attorney about your next trial date.</p>
<p><u>Criminal Cases Other Hearings</u></p>	<p>If you are scheduled to appear for any other type of hearing in a criminal case, pre-trial, preliminary hearing, etc., the matter will be rescheduled. The Court will send your attorney the date and time of your next court appearance. <u>You do not need to appear in court.</u></p>	<p>Contact the Public Defender or your attorney about your next hearing date.</p>
<p><u>Criminal Cases Witnesses</u></p>	<p>If you were subpoenaed to appear at a court hearing in a criminal case as a witness, please contact the attorney who issued the subpoena.</p>	<p>Stanislaus County District Attorney - 209-575-0785 (for recorded information) or 209-525-5550 (for information about your case)</p>
